


A composite HD video stream combining all 3 cameras (cams), 3 microphones (mics), documents, and a live paper-and-pencil display is conveyed by Microsoft Teams utilizing every pixel on students' screens. Two 4K-UHD TVs provide enough screen real estate to see all students' faces with constant two-way video visibility. I still call them by name if they are staring at the ceiling!



Student view: In this virtual classroom, old-school hand-written derivations are driven by student input, as in traditional times, with some new advantages: Multiple cameras allow seeing the professor's face continuously even as they watch him writing, the written sheets don't get erased between classes like a traditional board, students can adjust the sound level to their taste, and, of course, everyone has a front row seat!

Exams are answered with paper and pencil, proctored more strictly than in-class exams, & have constant live-voice access for questions. Grading is done by hand in the traditional style (no multiple-choice questions).

7.3) Please comment on what you feel are the positive and negative aspects of your instructor and his/her teaching outlook:
